Lance and Nandy will share their journeys and challenges applying occupational health, hygiene and safety practices in extremely remote and isolated locations with a focus on Africa

Lance is a passionate Health and Safety professional with a long history in the mining and minerals exploration space. He is part of Anglo American's Discovery & Geosciences team, where he is based in Perth, but a lot of his work spans different countries and functions — from occupational health and risk management to emergency preparedness and contractor safety.

Over the past 13 years with Anglo American, he has built deep experience across global exploration drilling safety, geophysical survey safety, vehicle and driver safety, remote work safety, aviation, and workforce health. He has significant experience in applying a practical, risk-based approach to some of the company's highest risk activities in some of the most remote corners of the world. Lance will focus on Safety and Health challenges when working off-the-grid and managing stakeholder expectations (*the company, the worker and the community*).

Nandy Blay is a UK-trained and AHPRA-registered Occupational Health Nurse Specialist with over 20 years' experience across healthcare, mining, infrastructure and regulatory sectors in the UK, Australia and internationally. For the past 15 years, she has worked as an independent specialist, designing and embedding occupational health systems within complex and high-risk environments. Nandy applies her systems-thinking approach to workplace health, with expertise in health risk assessment, psychosocial hazard management, pre-employment screening and rehabilitation case management.

Raised on a mining estate in Obuasi, Ghana, Nandy's connection to Africa is both personal and professional. She later established occupational health services for a Canadian gold-mining operation in Mali, transitioning provision from outsourced delivery to a prevention-focused, in-house model. Nandy will present case studies relating to risk assessment and management of chronic health conditions (Diabetes, Asthma, HIV and Eye Disease) within a mining site context in Africa.
